Join us this Jubilee Year as PILGRIMS OF HOPE

As we gathered with friends and family to celebrate the birth of our Lord, Pope Francis officially marked the beginning of the Church's Jubilee Year by opening the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica. The open door invites pilgrims to cross the threshold and renew their faith. Holy Doors are symbolic and are typically only opened during a Holy Year. In Rome, Holy Doors have also been opened at St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul's Outside the Wall. According to *Our Sunday Visitor News*, the opening of the Holy Doors represents, "the passage to salvation Jesus opened to humanity."

During this year-long celebration, which occurs once every 25 years, you will have opportunities to join the IHM Sisters in prayer and become, as the 2025 theme proclaims, "Pilgrims of Hope." Recently, the Sisters invited the public to participate in a service opening a Holy Door to the IHM Chapel. **Today, let's begin by sharing the official prayer of His Holiness Pope Francis for the Holy Year:**

Father in Heaven, may the faith you have given us in your Son, Jesus Christ, our Brother, and the flame of charity enkindled in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, reawaken in us the blessed hope for the coming of your Kingdom. May your grace transform us into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel. May those seeds transform from within both humanity and the whole cosmos in the sure expectation of a new heaven and a new earth, when, with the powers of evil vanquished, your glory will shine eternally. May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of Heaven. May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise forever. Amen

To Barbara Keiser, the Sisters of IHM at St. Agnes Parish in Lock Haven, Pennsylvania, were a part of the family when she was growing up. According to Barbara's sister, now Sister Mary Rita Smith, "There were five of us. Our mother would take the Sisters grocery shopping, and I cooked for them starting from when I was in 9th grade. Dad helped around the Parish. Barb and her good friend since grade school — Sandy Grieco — were also close with the IHM Sisters."

When Barb's sister and her best friend, Sandy, both joined the IHM Congregation, Barbara remained close to the Sisters who taught her the value and love of family and the importance of keeping commitments to carry out what we promise to do. She would describe them as loving and supportive.

Sister Mary Rita continues, "People described Barbara as funny, caring, and very loving. She kept a room at her home at the ready in case Sandy or I would come for a visit. Barb loved to have fun and to be with people. When she married Carson, they would host the Keiser family at their home in the summer for what they called 'Camp Keiser' — they even had t-shirts made up! They would think up all kinds of fun activities for the children and the adults. She loved to swim, and they had an above-ground pool in the backyard that she really enjoyed."

Barb attended the Methodist Church with Carson where she was supportive of his music ministry. She participated in events at St. Agnes and other community churches. Barb and Carson were frugal, saving money as they could. Barb worked as a payroll clerk for Wedmann and Teah Drug Stores, at a local dental office, and later, as a payroll clerk with the health system in Williamsport. According to Sister Mary Rita, "She always knew he wanted to leave money to the Sisters she loved so that they would be taken care of and they could continue their mission. She planned for it, so it was in place when she passed. Yes, our family had a longstanding commitment to support the IHM Sisters. This was also a very personal commitment for her."

The Sisters of IHM gathered in December to celebrate their community patronal feast day (December 8th), which is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, a Catholic Holy Day celebrating Mary's conception in the womb of her mother, St. Anne, free from original sin. The word "feast" comes from the Latin word which means "joy." Patronal refers to a heavenly protector and advocate for the community.

On their Feast Day, the Sisters gather to honor Mary, the first disciple and her answer "Yes" to God. There is a Mass, a renewal of vows for the Sisters, a re-commitment ceremony for the IHM Associates*, and a luncheon for those in attendance. WHY I GIVE by Patricia Lawler

Throughout my life, I have had many different leadership roles and some even say that I was born a leader. I would instead point back to the mentoring I received from the wonderful Sisters of IHM.

During my senior year of high school, my Dad guided me to apply to Marywood.

Though he died of a heart attack before the year ended, his guidance would change my life forever.

On campus, I felt an overwhelming sense of acceptance, beauty, and warmth. There was an old, prestigious building where the IHM Sisters lived. They spilled out of it each morning — dashing to class, talking with students, visiting the library, and coming back to Mass. The Sisters were the secret charm that made all the difference to many of us. We knew the Sisters were top-notch professors who held numerous degrees. They were passionate about their subject matter and were never too busy to redirect or explain. They were refined, educated, and confident women who warmed our souls and challenged our minds. Day in and day out for four years we get in front of the Sisters and their "print" of the Sisters and their "print



minds. Day in and day out for four years, we sat in front of the Sisters and their "spirit" rubbed off on us.

Senior year at Marywood, I was president of my class. My moderator was Sister Patricia Ann Matthews, IHM. She gave me Roberts Rules of Order and said, "Read it." Without even realizing it, I was being tutored in what I would call. "Leadership 101." She wanted me to be my best self. The tips she gave me included:

- 1. Be prepared. Have an Agenda.
- 2. Be direct. The class will take their cue from you.
- 3. Explain. Open it up for discussion. Things may get tense. If so, suggest a private discussion after the meeting.
- 4. Delegate. Ask for volunteers and Chairpersons. Create Committees. Remember that everyone should be welcome. It is your duty to work right along with them. Let them see and feel that you care just as much as they do.
- 5. Start and stop each meeting with a prayer

I grew to appreciate Sister Patricia Ann and all of the IHM Sisters that touched my life. In our discussions, I would disagree. Sister could be formidable. However, through this, I learned to have a voice. She taught me how important it is to talk and listen to each other. She taught me diplomacy. You must be willing to compromise.

In all of the leadership roles I have had, I always think back to Sister Patricia Ann. She influenced my life in the best of

ways. She molded me to become a good leader. I pray for the Sisters every day, because I know that I wouldn't be where I am today without the IHM Sisters. My memories of them are so strong. I will never stop supporting them. I am so very grateful for all that they did for all "Marywoodians."

Note: Sister Patricia Ann Matthews, IHM, passed away in 2008. Her fellow IHM Sisters noted that "Her belief that each person can make a difference formed her pedagogy as a teacher. Her passion for justice, her wisdom and faith, and her practice of effective problem-solving played an integral role in the transformation of Marywood from a liberal arts women's college to a comprehensive coeducational university and a premier Catholic institution of higher learning. She was a widely respected educator, scholar, consultant, and lecturer on higher education, including teaching, academic administration, professional development, gender issues, outcome assessment, and strategic planning."

Sister Jan Marie was multi-talented – an artist, musician, photographer, teacher, mentor, and liturgist. Her photographs grace the IHM Sisters' Remembrance Cards and were also made into individual cards and framed art. IHM Sister Kathleen Burns worked with Sister Jan Marie to finish this

photo journal. Although Sister Jan Marie passed before the book was completed, she was at peace knowing that Sister Kathleen understood and shared her goal for the journal -- that every image was inspiring, that it encouraged reflection, and that it would help viewers develop a deeper connection with the Divine.

"She was someone who noticed the beauty in everything," explains Sister Kathleen. "Her curiosity caused her to stop and look at things others would pass by. Medication distribution is much more efficient, allowing staff to spend more time with the Sisters. Immediate access to patient histories ensures that staff can provide timely and effective urgent care when necessary and improve overall patient outcomes.

Katie Carpenter, LPN, administers medications For the retired Sisters, this better, more efficient care allows them to more fully participate in their

prayer ministry and assist with projects in the Congregation.
